- 1. Welcome and Approval of the Agenda (Jaime)
 - a. Approved
- 2. Review of Minutes November 2021 (Jaime)
 - a. Approved minutes can be found on the School Council tab on the JYES website
- 3. Treasurer Report (Marit)
 - a. Maverick's Donuts, Kanata North e-transfer of \$20.48 (25% of online sales went to School Council)
 - b. Clothing orders grossed an additional \$40 for a total of \$3890.00, should net \$483.81
 - c. Poinsettia sales grossed \$300 and should net \$147.78
 - d. Silent auction at Holiday Tea raised \$1200
 - e. Bank Balance as of January 25, 2022 was \$7106.46
 - f. Outstanding written cheques to pay for teacher reimbursements and Hot Lunch refunds from 2019-2020.
 - g. Available funds = \$4951.32
- 4. OCASC Report (Dwayne/Kevin/Arron)
 - a. The last meeting was not attended.
 - b. Minutes can be found on the OCASC website.
 - c. There were no updates from the COW meeting, attended by Rob.
- 5. Principal's Report (Rob)
 - a. Staff absences: JY has been ok so far, we have been fortunate; but class closures may occur at some point. If classes are closed for in person learning, there will be asynchronous learning on VLE available for students. The school will try to inform parents by evening before should this happen.
 - b. Bussing: issues due to limited bus drivers. Some JYES bus routes have been experiencing cancellations: reminder for parents to watch for OSTA emails for updates on cancellations.
 - c. Report cards: available to parents for access virtually, will be sent by email on February 16th. Student OEN will be required for this access. No dedicated Parent/Teacher interview times specified at this time, but reach out to teachers if concerns.
 - d. Kindergarten Registration: It is ongoing and parents are encouraged to register soon! Information night occurring virtually (YouTube Live) for parents to view on February 1st at 6:30pm. Registration is going well so far, healthy numbers.
 - e. Fernbank Elementary School is planned to be opening in Fall 2022.

Approximately 100 students at JYES will be redirected. Students currently in Grade 5 will stay at JYES. Younger siblings of Grade 5 students can choose to stay at JYES as well. Mixed impacts across French and English streams.

- f. Rapid Antigen Tests: have been sent home with students.
- g. Thank you for your ongoing daily screening of children for covid prior to sending them to school. This is really our only tool at this point to stop the spread. Please continue to do everything possible to keep our community safe.
- h. Thank you for bringing/sending computers back following the virtual learning period. Thank you to our librarian, Cheryl Lajeuneusse, for her efforts in checking them in/out of school.
- i. Approximately 40 children are at home for now learning asynchronously by family choice. Hoping these numbers will decrease as vaccinations go up.

- a. Kinder (Rachel Carkner)
 - i. Have been having a lot of outside fun!
 - ii. Finalized purchases for the year at the last meeting, including butterflies that will be purchased.
- b. Primary (Nicole Castonguay)
 - i. Lots of outdoor play happening, so much fun in the snow! There is a lot of shovel play and fort building happening.
 - ii. Thank you for the spirit week donations, it was a super fun week!
 - iii. Looking for virtual concert ideas.
- c. Junior (Leigh Sinden)
 - Snowshoes, shovels and pails are of huge use with the 50 cm of snow on ground.
 - ii. Donations for spirit week: grateful for all the donations from parents during that time. Kids had a great time.
- 7. Upcoming Events/Call for Volunteers (Jaime)
